# Topic of the Month

#### Vaccination

Fall has arrived and it's time to think about some important things like harvesting, deer hunting, the presidential election and vaccination.

Ok, vaccination might not be as exciting or interesting as the others, but it may be more important than even harvesting, deer hunting or the election. Every year in late fall and early winter when the weather changes often, cows become susceptible to pneumonia. It's not the weather that causes it but the viruses and bacteria are better able to cause infection when the air is humid and the animals are stressed.

You can't control the weather, but you can prevent outbreaks. It's as simple as providing adequate ventilation for the cattle and vaccinating with the appropriate vaccine for your herd. If you're on a regular vaccination program at herd check, you're already covered. If you're on an annual or semiannual vaccination program, make sure to call us to order the vaccine, or simply order it from our website soon. If you're not on any vaccine program at all, by all means, please call us to get started. A small investment in vaccines this fall can literally save thousands of dollars in medicine, lost milk and dead animals.

U.S. Milk Quality Using Bulk-Tank Somatic Cell Counts, 2015

According to USDA's study of bulk tank somatic cell counts for four of ten Federal Milk Marketing Orders (FMO), average bulk tank somatic cell counts (BTSCC) have plateaued since 2012 at approximately 194,000. 99.8% of milk shipped, 99.4% of shipments and 96.6% of shippers were less than 750,000 BTSCC. Between 80 % and 90% of milk from the FMO were under 400,000 BTSCC.
