Topic of the Month

Coccidiosis

Fall is a good time of year to consider the effects of parasites on your herd. For most gastrointestinal parasites, a sensible protocol for pasture based herds is to treat with an oral dewormer twice in the spring and then after it frosts in the fall. But coccidia is a different type of parasite that is easily overlooked because it is not affected by standard dewormers. It can reproduce rapidly in infected animals and quickly contaminates the environment. It is particularly hard on young stock, causing malnutrition, diarrhea, occasionally neurologic signs, and death.

This particular parasite is easily diagnosed on routine parasite exams on manure samples. Merck Animal Health sponsors low cost parasite exams for producers. This could be a good time to talk to your herd veterinarian about the parasite risk in your herd and perhaps make use of available testing to improve the health of the next generation of milking cows on your farm.
