The fall grant application period is now open for numerous grants administered by the Center for Dairy Excellence, the Northeast Dairy Business Innovation Center, and others.

Available grants include:

- Dairy Excellence grants
- Dairy Processing grants
- Dairy Decisions Consultants grants
- Team Program grants
- On-Farm Milk Storage and Handling grants
- Technical Assistance grants for Value-Added and Direct Marketing
- Dairy Farm Innovation grants
- Dairy Food Safety and Certification grants
- Resource Enhancement and Protection grant.

The Dairy Excellence grants are probably the most competitive and have the shortest application window. It ends September 30. They provide money for improvements to recipient dairies. Other grants provide money for business planning, niche marketing, and conservation related endeavors. Many of the grants are very easy to apply for.
